Rental Assistance

- <u>Privately Owned Subsidized Housing</u> HUD helps apartment owners offer reduced rents to low-income tenants.
- <u>Public Housing</u> Affordable apartments for low-income families, the elderly and persons with disabilities. To apply, contact a public housing agency.
- <u>Housing Choice Voucher Program</u> Find your own place and use the voucher to pay for all or part of the rent.
- <u>HUD in Montana</u> a wide range of useful information for renters
- <u>Essential Services</u> connection to important community services.

Energy Assistance

- Montana Low Income Energy Assistance Program (LIEAP) Pays part of winter energy bills for income eligible people.
- <u>Montana Weatherization Program</u> Helps participants to improve the heating efficiency of their home and thus reduce their energy consumption.
- Energy Share of Montana Energy Share of Montana is a private nonprofit organization. Our primary purpose is to help Montanans faced with energy emergencies meet their needs and move towards self-reliance. Since its inception in 1982 Energy Share has distributed 10.5 million dollars in energy assistance to more than 34,000 families.
