BILLINGS -- A leading equine nutritionist, Dr. Judith A. Reynolds will speak Thursday, Sept. 10, 2009 at 7 p.m., at the Fortin Education Center auditorium, on the Rocky Mountain College campus. Her lecture, "Equine Nutrition in the 21st Century," is free and open to the public.

Dr. Reynolds is the lead equine nutritionist and equine product and technical manager for Arthur Daniels Midland Alliance Nutrition, Inc. of Quincy, Ill.

"Dr. Reynolds is a popular speaker at horse nutrition meetings for horse owners and veterinarians across the U.S. and Canada, and we're very happy to have her as our guest," said Scott Neuman RMC director, equestrian studies.

She has lectured at Texas A & M University, Colorado State University, Purdue University, and The Ohio State University, as well as trade shows and horse fairs. She is a writer for the ADM Web site and is an award-winning contributor to EquiSearch.com.

She received a bachelor of science degree in biology and teaching from St. Cloud State University in Minnesota and a master of science degree in animal science from Texas A&M University. She holds a doctorate in nutrition, which included equine nutrition

research, from Texas A&M University.

Her research has involved bone and mineral metabolism in growing and racing horses and the genetic disorder, Hyperkalemic Periodic Paralysis, in Quarter Horses. She recently served as an official reviewer for the National Research Council's Nutrient Requirements of Horses, 6th Edition, published in 2007. This text is considered the premier source of information about horse feeding throughout the world.
