Message from the Director

The library staff continued to implement many changes over the past fiscal year. The Academic Resource Center was completed in the fall and opened in the spring. The library welcomed the writing center and a search was conducted for a director of the Academic Resource Center. Bobbi Otte served on the search committee for a director and Sara Whittle was hired and will begin July 1, 2016. The library hosted Kristen McCall an intern from MSU-Billings in the spring. For International Week the library hosted an International Game Night which was well received and fun to host and Kristen helped prepare for the evening by doing research on each game to find its origin. She also copy cataloged the Montana Geology Collection so it would be better able to be found in the library catalog. Kristen also spent time in the archives going through old alumni papers and sorting them for further review by archives staff.

The library, as a member of the Billings Area Health Sciences Information Consortium (Bahsic), hosted Pubmed training conducted by Kim Hart the medical librarian at Billings Clinic. A new academic library consortium was formed called Trails (Treasure State Academic Information & Library Services). It is the result of the Montana Academic Library Consortium task force that Bobbi served on. A memorandum of understanding amongst the institutions was signed and the consortium proceeded with negotiations of several products. The first project was the Unified Resource Management system. The University of Montana was the lead institution and handled the logistics of getting bids and setting up demonstrations from various vendors. Ex-Libris was chosen as the vendor. They are the library's current vendor for PRIMO, the library's discovery service. In anticipation of moving data from our current system to the new system the library staff undertook the task of cleaning up our patron database and catalog records. The library was able to conduct a pre and post-test of all campus compass sections and found that with even 20 minutes of instruction most students improved. In late May the library was informed that the state library would be discontinuing support for the Ebsco Databases. This was a huge blow as the library had been receiving these databases for free for more than a decade. Trails will begin negotiations with vendors to try to recover at least essential databases and possibly deals for some of the more specialized databases. Regardless there will now be a cost associated with these databases and fewer will be able to be offered. Hannah Micona the Assistant Library Director chose to not renew her contract in May. Her last day was June 29, 2016. A search committee was assembled and began the process of looking for a new Assistant Library Director.

Bobbi Otte (Library Director)

Attended the Montana Library Association conference in Missoula. In addition Bobbi was invited to serve on the collection development committee for TRAILS. Bobbi continued to serve as the treasurer of the Billings Area Health Sciences Information Consortium (Bahsic) and on the Intellectual Freedom Committee of the Montana Library Association. Bobbi is serving on the Montana Information Literacy Alliance which is working on providing opportunities for all residents of Montana to become information literate. There is a special emphasize on school

libraries as they are the hardest hit by the loss of the Ebsco Databases. She served on the Judicial and Academic Standards committees on campus.
